- School has improved greatly this year due to new head and teachers.









World Science Week



Momo Challenge

It has come to our attention this week that there is a new online craze known as the The Momo Challenge. It is described as a WhatsApp 'suicide challenge'. It features an avatar of a creepy-looking woman with bulging eyes, stringy black hair and a devilish grin, telling young people to harm themselves.

The game requires young people to add a contact on WhatsApp before the doll-like character hounds them with violent images and escalating dares, the last of which demands they kill themselves.

National reports suggest the 'game' could be linked to the deaths of youngsters in Colombia, Argentina and India in recent years.

The game hides itself in the form of other normal-looking games so that parents do not suspect it. It has been reported that Roblox players have been invited join the momo challenge

To stay safe, parents are warned to always be aware of what their children are watching and reading online, and if possible, limit the apps they can access.

If a parent suspects a Momo is targeting their child, police advice is to delete and block the number immediately.

A group of Year 9 students were invited to attend the second cycle of John Moore University's outreach project: 'The Chemistry of Large Molecules'. They learnt about the structure and qualities of polymers and monomers. They made slime and had a great time experimenting how stretchy and bouncy it was.

Their next experiment was with polymorph, a substance which, when warm, is pliable and goes hard on cooling. They made their initials and a variety of little objects. All of our students agreed it was a fabulous session.






Arrange the given digits to make three 3 digit numbers such that the second is double the first and the third is three times the first. 4 digits have been positioned already.
