Dear Parents and Carers

It was a pleasure to welcome back all our students last week, particularly those who started with us for the first time, in nursery, reception and Year 7. They looked incredibly smart and have set their standards high for an excellent year ahead. I would like to thank all parents and carers that have supported us by ensuring that uniform and equipment are bought; it is the very simple things that make such a huge difference. Last year we had an excellent year and outcomes improved in all phases. Year 2 and Year 6 did incredibly well in their SATs and there was a significant improvement in the progress of students in the secondary phase. Attendance improved across the school significantly; excellent attendance is crucial to success and that is why we have risen our expectations to 97% this year.

## **Primary Department**

#### Welcome back everyone!

It has been lovely to see all of the children (and their families) back at school after the summer holidays. The children look very smart in their uniform – thankyou so much everyone!

We are delighted to welcome three new and very talented staff members to the Primary Department this school year. Mr Alex Relph Y3, Mr Tom Ray Y4 and Miss Christine Mulligan in our Infant Resource Base. Please introduce yourself and say hello when you get the opportunity.

Remember our new times are start 8.40am and finish 2.50pm. We have had some slip ups this week with pupils arriving late but we expect everyone to be on time now as learning starts straight away and if your child is late they have to then catch up!

We have made some exciting changes to our curriculum this year with new topics, key concepts and real outcomes for each topic. Each class will experience a range of teachers for different subject specialities (including some of our talented and specialist secondary colleagues). Having spoken to some of the children they are already excited about their learning and the opportunities for new experiences.

After listening to your concerns about congestion in the mornings and after a successful trial, KS2 pupils now have the option to enter school through the front doors (from the Plaza) or through the playground doors. This means that the staff will split their forces to collect a whole year group. We still want you to have the opportunity to speak to your child's class teacher so staff will alternate front and back (see below).

Any legal change of surname must be supported by the relevant legal documents before information can be updated on our system.

**MYEd** is the free parent app that gives you a multitude of communication and information features to stay in touch with what is going on at school. The app gives you direct access to your child's attendance, timetable, absence records, achievements, behaviour and much, much more. You will also see that we update and change the information in the app as the school year moves along.

We are able to send you messages directly to the **MYEd** app relating to important information about your child's education and to remind you of events that are taking place at school. You will receive a notification if we send you a message and there is no charge for the messages you send to us.

# World Mental Health Day ~ 10th October 2019

Young people's mental health and wellbeing has never been so important. These statistics show just how big – and growing – the problem is for young people in the UK.

- 1 in 8 children have a diagnosable mental health disorder that's roughly 3 children in every classroom.
- 1 in 6 young people aged 16-24 has symptoms of a common mental disorder such as depression or an anxiety disorder.
- Half of all mental health problems manifest by the age of 14, with 75% by age 24.

In 2017, suicide was the most common cause of death for both boys (16.2% of all deaths) and girls (13.3%) aged between 5 and 19.

Here at The Grange Academy, we recognise the importance of supporting all of our children and young people in order to ensure they have positive mental health. On 10<sup>th</sup> October we will be joining with millions of people nationwide in supporting World Mental Health Day.

To raise awareness of this important issue, all students will be given the opportunity to wear a yellow accessory during the day (head band, bow, hair clips, socks, tie, scarf, badge or wristband) and staff will also be dressing in yellow to show our support.

There will be various activities taking place in school for our young people to gain more awareness of how to support their own positive mental health, and we will be joined by expertly trained staff from outside agencies who can demonstrate what support is available in the local area if our young people need additional help.
