<u>Nursery</u> 90.6% - last year 84.9%



MP praises Year 9 pupils getting a taste of university

Local MP, Derek Twigg, visited Year 9 pupils on Friday 28th September to hear about their progress as part of The Scholars Programme – a prestigious national scheme which gives school pupils an opportunity to experience university-style learning.

The programme recruits, trains and places PhD researchers in non-selective state schools to deliver universitystyle tutorials based on their own research to small groups of pupils. The pupils Derek Twigg met with today are studying a course entitled *Geography - The Anthropocene v Deep Time* with their tutor Dominic Coe from University of Liverpool. As part of the programme, the pupils visited two highly-selective universities, where they received information, advice and guidance about university life and making a successful university application. The Scholars Programme is run by The Brilliant Club, an award-winning charity whose aim is increase the number of pupils from under-represented backgrounds progressing to highly-selective universities.

Derek Twigg said:

"It was great to visit The Grange Academy today, and meet pupils taking part in The Scholars Programme. I was very impressed at how they engaged with such a complex and challenging academic topic. It just goes to show what young people from Halton can achieve if we give them the opportunity. I wish the pupils the very best for the future, and I encourage more schools to give their pupils the chance to benefit from this programme".

"I was delighted to meet with Derek Twigg and show them the work pupils are doing in The Scholars Programme. I'm proud of the achievements of our pupils who are participating and am excited to see how their participation inspires their study and university choices." General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)

Due to new GDPR guidelines, any requests for changes to phone numbers, addresses, legal names etc must now be made in writing from a parent, carer or legal guardian. This will need to be signed and dated by the person completing it and handed in at the front office before any amendments can be made. The written information required is as follows:

- Student full name and DOB
- Parent/carer/legal guardian full name
- Current phone number/address/name which will be changed
- New phone number/address/name to change to
- Signed and dated

We can no longer accept any amendments to details verbally over the phone.

Any legal change of surname must be supported by the relevant legal documents before information can be updated on our system.

Reminder for Parents/Carers

Please could all parents and carers ensure that students are leaving for school each morning with the relevant equipment. The office staff are continually passing equipment to students which they should have brought in with them in the morning, for example, packed lunches, PE kits, cookery ingredients, water bottles, inhalers etc.

Each time an item is taken to a classroom this can interrupt the learning of not only your child but the whole class, which is something we are keen to reduce.

Primary Phase Students

For all primary phase students (Reception to Year 6) school finishes at 3:00pm. It is not acceptable for students to be picked up early unless in **exceptional** circumstances. If a medical appointment has been unavoidably arranged during school hours then parents/carers are required to provide medical evidence for this.

If there are any messages that need passing to school staff, for example a change in who is picking a child up, please can this information be passed to school staff in a morning.

Secondary Phase Students

For all secondary phase students (Year 7 to Year 11) school finishes at 2.40pm. It is not acceptable for students to be picked up early unless in **exceptional** circumstances. If a medical appointment has been unavoidably arranged during school hours then parents/carers are required to provide medical evidence for this prior to the appointment. This ensures that the relevant information can be attached to the learner's register to give the teachers prior notice.

Messages can be passed to Secondary phase students during school hours in the event of emergencies only.

Paris trip – Friday 19th – Monday 22nd October 2018

We are 5 weeks away from our trip to Paris and we are all getting excited. Thank you to all the parents, carers and students who attended the Paris information evening where the full itinerary was outlined. This will briefly recap any information that was given at the meeting. The staff that will be going on the trip are Miss Wing, Mr Passmore, Miss Atkinson, Miss Cooper and Mr Vine. We are all very excited to be going.

Please can passports, European health cards and medical forms be handed in as soon as possible. Thank you to everyone who has already given theirs in. Any students who take medication will need to bring the relevant medication with them as well as a spare one labelled with their full name, required dosage and how often to take the medicine.

Money for the trip needs to be handed in before **Thursday 18th October 2018** and needs to be in a labelled envelope with the students full name and amount inside. I recommended £10 travelling down from England and £10 travelling back up to England. Then €100 for Paris and Disneyland.




