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Social Media Age Restrictions

We know that social media services are popular with young people of all ages. Parents have an important role in helping prepare their children to go online before they start to use social media platforms.


The COPPA law or Children's Online Privacy Protection Act states that any organisations or people operating online services (including social media services) are not allowed to collect the personal information of anyone under the age of 13 without parental permission.

WhatsApp have announced a change to their terms and conditions for users based in Europe. Users will now need to be 16 to use WhatsApp. WhatsApp's new age limit has been chosen in response to the new General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) which came into effect from the 25th May 2018.

Nearly all other social media services require users to be at least 13 years of age to access and use their services. This includes **Facebook**, **Snapchat**, **Twitter**, **Instagram**, **Musical.ly** and **Skype**.

Whilst there is no age restriction for watching videos on **YouTube**, users need to be 13 or older to have their own YouTube account (enabling them to subscribe to other channels, like videos, post comments, share their own content and flag inappropriate content).

These rules around age relate to privacy, but also are relevant to safety. Some services offer additional protection for users who are registered as under 18, and by supplying a fake age young people can potentially lose some of this protection. Young people also risk being exposed to content which is intended for older users when they use sites that are not designed for people their age.



General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)

Due to new GDPR guidelines, any requests for changes to phone numbers, addresses, legal names etc must now be made in writing from a parent, carer or legal guardian on a Change of Details Form. Please call into reception to request a form or alternatively this can be downloaded from our website:

This will need to be completed, signed and dated by the person with parental responsibility and handed in at the front office with a form of ID (passport, driving licence, bank card etc) before any amendments can be made.

We can no longer accept any amendments to details verbally over the phone or by text.

Any legal change of surname must be supported by the relevant legal documents before information can be updated on our system.

World Mental Health Day ~ 10th October 2019

Young people's mental health and wellbeing has never been so important. These statistics show just how big – and growing – the problem is for young people in the UK.

- 1 in 8 children have a diagnosable mental health disorder that's roughly 3 children in every classroom.
- 1 in 6 young people aged 16-24 has symptoms of a common mental disorder such as depression or an anxiety disorder.
- Half of all mental health problems manifest by the age of 14, with 75% by age 24.

In 2017, suicide was the most common cause of death for both boys (16.2% of all deaths) and girls (13.3%) aged between 5 and 19.

Here at The Grange Academy, we recognise the importance of supporting all of our children and young people in order to ensure they have positive mental health. On 10th October we will be joining with millions of people nationwide in supporting World Mental Health Day.

To raise awareness of this important issue, all students will be given the opportunity to wear a yellow accessory during the day (head band, bow, hair clips, socks, tie, scarf, badge or wristband) and staff will also be dressing in yellow to show our support.

There will be various activities taking place in school for our young people to gain more awareness of how to support their own positive mental health, and we will be joined by expertly trained staff from outside agencies who can demonstrate what support is available in the local area if our young people need additional help.
