

This was to promote engagement and raise the profile Maths, we did this through the use of Instagram.



Road Safety

Despite parent/carer/drivers having access to the school car park and the drop off and go system, many are still choosing to double park on the keep clear zig zags and double yellow lines. This behaviour is restricting the line of sight of the 'lollipop lady' making it extremely hazardous for pedestrians to cross the road safely even with her assistance.





In addition the buses and emergency vehicles frequently have problems trying to navigate through Latham Avenue due to the double parking.

In view of this, the Road Safety Team from Halton Borough Council plan to carry out a 2 week campaign outside the school, in conjunction with the police. This will involve speaking to parents, children and handing out road safety literature. We also plan to display 1m high pop ups of school children each displaying a road safety message.

Staying Healthy

We have recently had a lot of children who have been absent due to flu symptoms or vomiting bugs. Hear are a few reminders to help you stay healthy during the winter months:



- Wash your hands frequently, especially after blowing your nose, coughing, sneezing, being with ill people and especially before you eat.
- Avoid sharing objects.
- Avoid touching your nose, mouth and eyes.
- Get enough sleep and avoid getting "run down"
- Use tissues for coughs and sneezes and dispose of them immediately and appropriately.
- Eat right and get regular exercise.
- Avoid crowds and keep your distance from people whom you know are ill.
