Thank you parents and carers for your ongoing support. We are better when we work together.



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Welcome to Dobbie and Ron





We are very excited to introduce our new school visitors – Dobbie and Ron.

Dobbie (black and white) and Ron (ginger) are Canine Therapy dogs. They are highly trained to work in schools with children.

Dobbie and Ron also have a highly trained owner who will visit with them and manage each session as the owner knows the dogs best and is tuned to their mood.

Canine therapy dogs are calm and friendly and able to happily tolerate lots of attention from children.

Dobbie and Ron are going to visit the Primary phase for 1 hour every fortnight and will be used for a range of reasons including, with groups of children to support reading, attendance, emotional needs or to build confidence.

The sessions and are governed by how the dog feels, so if too much the owner will decide to either give the dog a break or leave until next visit. We are very excited to meet them. Miss Gittins has been working hard (since before Covid lockdown) to bring a therapy dog to our school, so we are delighted that finally we have been matched with such beautiful dogs.

Brilliant Club Graduation

On Wednesday 17th May, a group of year 8 students attended the University of Liverpool for their Brilliant Club Graduation. 12 students completed the course; having weekly tutorials from a university tutor and completed an essay on Literary Theory. 




