
Catch up for Secondary students returning from an absence:



We are able to send you messages directly to the **MYEd** app relating to important information about your child's education and to remind you of events that are taking place at school. You will receive a notification if we send you a message and there is no charge for the messages you send to us.



Primary

In Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2, Primary phase students can choose to have a breakfast bagel should they wish. These will be served in their classrooms from 8.45am until 9.00am. In Nursery, Reception and our Primary Bases we will be able to offer students a choice of cereals with milk or a bagel.

<u>Secondary</u>

In the Secondary phase, our students can access breakfast in the school dining hall from 8.00am until 8.25am and choose from bagels and a range of cereals with milk. Secondary Resource Base students have the opportunity to make their own breakfast from a range of items.




We have had a fantastic start to this year's Runcorn Schools Football league with 3 games, 3 wins and 10 superb goals scored. Well done to everyone involved!






Numeracy Challenge
