Background Information

We will be looking at some of the basic drama skills that we need to used during scripted performances. These skills will then be used in all of our future topics and modules and the Rules of Rehearsals will be especially important.

Key terms and Skills	
Freeze Frames	Still images, like taking a photograph, that allow the audience to focus on what is happening.
Narration	Using our bodies to create props or objects that can be used within a scene.
Thought Tracking	When a character tells the audience how and what they are thinking on the inside.
Characterisation	How we act to show the character that we are portraying. This includes a range of physical and vocal skills.
Physical Qualities	All of the parts of our acting that focus on how we move, the gestures we use and how we stand and look like our character
Vocal Qualities	All of the parts of our acting that focus on how we talk, vocally communicate and make sound like our character.
Line Learning	The process of learning our lines so that we don't rely on the script.

Rules of Rehearsals

Stay FACING THE AUDIENCE audience when you are speaking – no backs to the audience

Stay in CHARACTER throughout the performance

LISTEN to each other and **REACT** to what the characters are saying

TAKE TIME saying your lines - you don't need to rush

PROJECT your voice so that we can hear you
