Background Information



Key terms and Skills	
Freeze Frames	Still images, like taking a photograph, that allow the audience to focus on what is happening.
Narration	Using our bodies to create props or objects that can be used within a scene.
Choral Speaking	Two or more people saying the same thing at the same time.
Devising	Creating your own theatre. This means that you don't use a script, but instead create the scenes yourself.
Script Writing	Writing your own scene, script that can be performed. We will explore the key things that should be included within a scripted piece.
Music & Lyrics	The incorporation of music and lyrics within a drama performance to help tell the story and set the mood of the piece.

Cyber Bullying: Cyberbullying is bullying that takes place over digital devices like mobile phones, computers, and tablets. Cyberbullying can occur through SMS, Text, and apps, or online in social media, forums, or gaming where people can view, participate in, or share content. Cyberbullying includes sending, posting, or sharing negative, harmful, false, or mean content about someone else. It can include sharing personal or private information about someone else causing embarrassment or humiliation. Some cyberbullying crosses the line into unlawful or criminal behaviour.

- Devising your own advert to raise awareness about Cyber Bullying
- Working with a script, using the Rules of Rehearsal
- Writing your own scene from a given starting point.



Rules of Rehearsals

Stay FACING THE AUDIENCE audience when you are speaking - no backs to the audience.

Stay in CHARACTER throughout the performance

LISTEN to each other and REACT to what the characters are saying

TAKE TIME saying your lines - you don't need to rush

PROJECT your voice so that we can hear you
