

Mixing tracks ensures that the most important parts are heard and that the final result sounds balanced between all the parts.

There are a number of ways you can do this.

Setting each track's volume:
Use the slider on the left hand side of each track to find an appropriate level for each track.



Setting each track's pan level:
Use the pan dial to change the pan. Turn to the left or right respectively to move the track to the left or right of the mix.

Using the track slider and pan dial changes the settings for the entire track. You can fine tune the dynamics within the track by using **automation curves**.



Click on the track and press "A" on your keyboard to open the automation settings.

Clicking on the automation graph will create a dot.

You can change the automation setting by creating a series of dots and moving the graph between 2 consecutive dots.

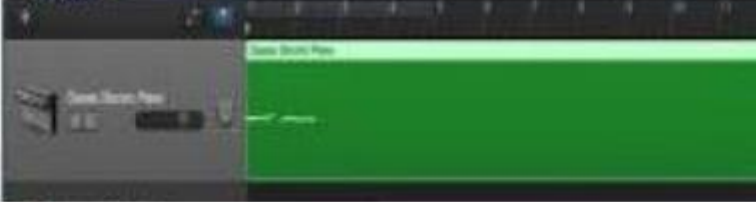

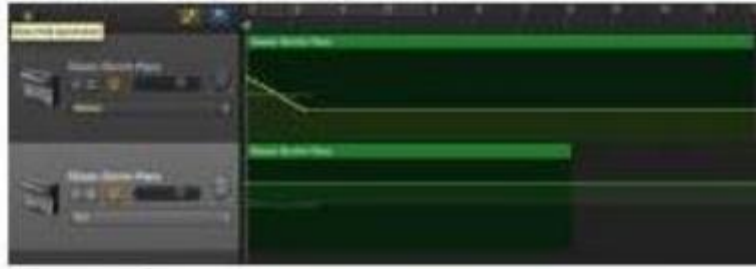
