Did you know?

90% attendance = ¹/₂ day missed every week.
1 school year at 90% attendance = 4 whole school weeks of lessons missed.
3 days missed in a half term means less than 90% attendance.
80% attendance during one school year = 38 days of school missed.

Top Tips for Top school attendance:

Make sure your uniform is ready and your school bag packed the night before.

Set the alarm clock early enough to allow plenty of time to get ready.

Remember we have a free breakfast available to all students every day in the dining hall.

Ensure medical/dental appointments are made out of school hours - if you do have an appointment during the school day aim to come into school either before or after the appointment.

If you are under the weather, but well enough for school, come in. If you are too unwell for school, we will contact your parents/guardian and arrange for you to go home.



MYEd is the free parent app that gives you a multitude of communication and information features to stay in touch with what is going on at school. The app gives you direct access to your child's attendance, timetable, absence records, achievements, behaviour and much, much more. You will also see that we update and change the information in the app as the school year moves along.

We are able to send you messages directly to the **MYEd** app relating to important information about your child's education and to remind you of events that are taking place at school. You will receive a notification if we send you a message and there is no charge for the messages you send to us.

Primary Department Summer Uniform


As previously advertised the Summer uniform for the Primary Pupils is;


