### **MODERN FOREIGN LANGUAGES (PRIMARY)**


This term, Year 3 students have been learning names of animals in Spanish. They have had fun working together and practising their Spanish.

Year 4 students have been learning how to talk about families, they have introduced their family members to each other through speaking and listening activities.


In Year 5, students have been learning how to talk about classroom objects and what is in their pencil cases.

### **SUBJECT IN THE SPOTLIGHT:**

### MODERN FOREIGN LANGUAGES (SECONDARY)

Year 7 students began the term looking at the many different and interesting ways that New Year's Eve is celebrated across the Spanish speaking world, which range from eating 12 grapes on each chime of the clock at midnight to putting three potatoes under your sofa, one peeled, one half peeled and one unpeeled. They were then set a challenge, to apply their understanding of all of the key knowledge they had learned in the first term by writing sentences in Spanish about their Spanish persona from memory. The results of the challenge were impressive. Well done Year 7.

In Year 8 and 9 students began the term talking about their New Year's resolutions in French and Spanish. Currently Year 8 students are learning how to talk about where they live and they will be exploring life in the Spanish speaking world. Year 9 students completed a piece of writing to further develop their French personas which they started in Year 7. The use of a wider variety of language and structures is becoming more evident in Year 9 work which is great to see. Especially when it is from memory.

To help students in Key Stage 3 learn key language from memory we are setting them learning homeworks using an online learning platform called 'The Language Gym'. Students have been testing their knowledge of key language using a variety of games.

In Key Stage 4, Year 10 students have been developing their GCSE exam writing skills in Spanish by learning how to successfully respond to 90 and 150 word tasks on the topic of technology. Students are becoming more confident using different time frames and a range of opinions, as well as using adventurous language and structures.

In Year 11, students have been exploring the topics of social and global issues, focusing on charity work, volunteering and environmental issues. They have been building up their knowledge of topical key language as well as developing their exam skills in these topic areas.
