
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to our new Year 7 cohort



WoW - Word of the Week

Word of the Week (WoW) is our weekly investigation into vocabulary. Each week we look at a high-frequency, useful word (which may be difficult to interpret) and explore the definition, sounds, spelling, word-families, grammar and history surrounding it.

(week beginning 1st March)

This week's word is **adjective** (noun) - a word that describes a noun (the name of a thing or a place)

> (week beginning 8th March) This week's word is prime (adjective)

prime number (noun) special numbers, greater than 1, that have exactly two factors
