Mobile phones are a wonderful technology that enrich our lives in many ways, however in schools they are often a distraction from learning.

In the summer term we will be taking steps to uphold the existing policy which is mobile phones/smart devices should not be brought onto the academy premises by students.

Parents who wish their child to have a mobile phone on their person, to protect them from everyday risks involving personal security and safety on the way to and from the academy, must support this policy by expecting their child to hand their phone/device to staff during registration at the start of the day. The phone should clearly labelled with the child's name and form. (Bags will be provided if necessary.)

This phone/device will then be available to collect at the end of the day. We have invested in secure boxes with protective foam to keep them safe and secure.

Our new rewards policy will be in place after the Easter holidays this will give more opportunities to reward students for doing the right thing.








Year 3 focussed on author Roald Dahl and made Snozzcumber sandwiches. They used prepositions in their writing to write instructions. They also made dream jars.

Many thanks and congratulations to the staff who participated in the event and made it such a success. Your costumes were fabulous.






