



# Reception Practical Learning from Home



Here are a selection of different practical activities you might like to try at home - please just do whatever you can.

English	Maths	Wellbeing (PSHE, SMSC & RE)
<p>*Continue to work on letters c, a, d, g, q, o, e, s, b, h, k, m, n, p and r from last time but add in the “ladder letters” that go down first like a ladder – l, i, t, u, j, y.</p> <p>*Choose a sound and ask your child to find you items beginning with that sound around the house.</p> <p>*Tricky word splat – Write the tricky words onto individual pieces of paper - l, to, no, go, into, the, he, she, me, we, be. Tell your child a word and they have to use their hand to splat the word. Record how many they get correct in a tally chart. They might be able to play against someone else at home! (We had started to teach them to use tally charts so they might like to do that to record their scores.)</p> <p>*Can you write any of the above words in a simple sentence? E.g. She is my mum. He is my dad.</p> <p>*Re-tell the story of The 3 Little Pigs. Discuss the homes that the pigs built. What would you build a house made out of and why?</p>	<p>*Give each toy a number and create a number line with your toys and their numbers. You might even be able to put your toys into size order!</p> <p>*Can you make any shapes with items you can find around the house such as putting your toys in the shape of a rectangle etc.</p> <p>*Count out the correct amount of knives and forks needed to lay the table. Add how many you have altogether. Knives and forks are in teams of 2, can you start to count in 2’s</p> <p>*Maybe use some spoons to see you can create the shape of a house. Will it be big or small?</p> <div data-bbox="819 775 1207 999" style="text-align: center;"> </div>	<p>*Make a little house for your toys or teddies.</p> <p>*Look at family photos from when you were younger. Are there any of your house? Has your house changed since you were little? Have you ever lived anywhere else? Can you ask some family members to send you photos of the front of their houses to compare and discuss?</p> <p>*When you go for a walk talk to your grown-ups about different types of houses you see. <p>*See picture news ideas attached to discuss ‘Where We Live’. Children can sort items into different rooms and design their own house!</p> <div data-bbox="311 1318 483 1481" style="text-align: center;"> </div>	<p>*Go outside to make a nature bracelet. To make nature bracelets, wrap a piece of wide tape loosely around each child's wrist with the sticky side out. Head outside on your walk and have the children find bits of nature—pinecones, leaves, seeds, or flowers—and simply stick them to their tape bracelet until there's no room left!</p> <div data-bbox="1397 1283 1565 1474" style="text-align: center;"> </div>	<p>*If you see a postman or a bin man doing their job say thank you as they pass for delivering your mail or emptying your bins.</p> <p>*Can you help to sort the washing by putting the light clothes, dark clothes and colored clothes in separate piles – maybe you could compare the</p>




different sizes of the clothes that have been washed
