Use the questions below to help you organise your writing into paragraphs. Where and when did you discover the magic carpet? Where did the carpet take you? Describe the journey and the setting. What problem did you face? Was there a dangerous creature? How did you overcome/solve your problem? Science Have 2 glasses of water with an equal amount of water in each. In the first glass of water, stir three tablespoons of table salt. Measure three tablespoons of sugar and mix it into the second glass of water. Place both glasses next to each other on a counter out of the sunshine. Record the rate of evaporation the sugar and salt have on the water by measuring the amount of water each day. Keep track of the results over a period of five days, note which glass of water evaporated at a faster rate. You could draw pictures and write a sentence each day to record results.  Key words: Evaporation: When liquid turns into a gas.	Art Create a piece of artwork from recycled materials. Be as creative as you want!	Can you create your own secret code? You could use letters, numbers, pictures or something else! Can you get someone else to try and crack it?  Make a list of all the electrical items in each room of your home. Can you come up with any ideas to use less electricity?
