






# Reception Practical Learning from Home



Here are a selection of different practical activities you might like to try at home - please just do whatever you can.

English	Maths	Wellbeing (PSHE, SMSC & RE)
<p>*Continue to work on letters c,a,d,g,q,o,e,s from last time but add in the “one armed robot” set of letters which are b, h, k, m, n, p and r</p> <p>*Use a picture book that you know to help you retell a familiar story – can you find some of the “one armed robot letters” in the title or in the blurb on the back of the story? Does the author/illustrators name begin with any of the letters?</p> <p>*Practice writing the tricky words the, I, all, are, and – make sure all the letters are sitting on the line, the tall letters are tall, the small letters and small and the tail letters go under the line. Can you use these words in a talking sentence? Can you write these words within a sentence?</p>	<p>*Play football in your garden and use some things such as jackets to put out as a goal. Keep a tally chart of who can score the most out of 5 shots. (Remember that there are four lines down and one that goes across to stop the other 4 from running away!)</p> <p>*Keep talking about numbers 1-20. Hide numbers around the house and see if your child can collect them all and put them in the right order</p> <p>*Hide a piece of paper with a number on and get them to bring you the corresponding number of items to do with this e.g. 6 socks or 8 pegs – please work with numbers up to 20 to try to ensure a solid understanding of these numbers.</p> <p>*Make a list of your favourite fruits. What will be number 1? Could you work out which fruit is the most popular in your house? Which fruit will be the winner? (Miss Stockton likes nectarines and neither Miss Stockton or Miss Weston like mangos – do you know what these fruits are?)</p> <p>*We should be getting good at our days of the week now with our special song – Days of the week. Which day did The Hungry Caterpillar come out of the egg? Can you make a caterpillar of your favourite things you have eaten this week?</p> 	<p>*Make a den in your house where you can go for some calm time.</p> <p>*Do something kind each day for someone in your house. This could be helping grown-ups do jobs in the house, make them a picture or a card etc.</p> <p>*Tell someone why you love them and say thank you for something they have done for you that is special.</p> <p>*Put a teddy bear or cuddly toy in the window for people to spot when they are out for a walk.</p> 
Humanities & The World (Science, History, Geography)	Creative (Art, DT, Music, Computing and MFL)	Independent Learning
<p>*Make a little bug hotel in your garden using things you have in your house like kitchen roll tubes, bottles and things you can find in your garden such as leaves and twigs etc. Investigate which insects arrive during the next few weeks.</p> 	<p>*Have a go at making your own butterfly. Fold paper in half so you can see the line down the middle. Squeeze different colours of paint into the middle and fold over. Gently squidge the paint to the edges of the paper with flat hands. Open up and see your fantastic butterfly! Or use felt tips and ensure you draw the same pattern on each side – you could use a mirror to help you! This is called symmetry and isn't something we have looked at before – it is when two things are exactly the same on both sides – can you find anything else in your house that is symmetrical (plates with patterns, fabric, etc.).</p>	<p>*Can you set the table for tea time?</p> <p>*Can you help to sort the washing by putting the pairs of socks together?</p> <p>*Can you help to tidy up your toys? (We know you are great at this – remember “choose it, use it, put it away, then you'll have more time to play”.</p>
