Remember when we wrote instructions on how to make a beast soup. We used the words; first, next, then, after that and finally so we know when we need to do certain things. I have attached my instructions on how to make a sandwich so you know what yours should look like.</p> <p>Dear Diary At the minute we are living in a time that will one day be history and lots of people will learn about it. You could help by writing your own diary. Each day you can write 2 or 3 sentences about what you have been up to or something you have learnt. Then we watched the Trolls film and it was really fun.</i></p> <p>Super Spellings Can you become a spelling superhero? We have attached a sheet of some of our spellings for you to practice. You could write them with fancy pens or write them in some sand or make the spellings out of playdough. Think of some creative ways to help you to remember them.</p> <p>Reading Can you choose your favourite book from this week and send me a video about it? Tell me what happens in the book. Why you liked the book. Would you recommend it to a friend? How many marks would you give it out of 10?</p> <p>Handwriting We have attached a list of words for you to practice in your best handwriting. Remember your tall letters like- t, l, k, h, b, d need to be tall. Your tail letters need to hand their tail underneath the line y, g, j, q And your small letters need to be small.</p>	<p>Number Card Challenge Time for you to make a maths game. You can play this by yourself or with somebody in your house. Make some number cards up to 10 (20 for a Challenge) and turn them all over so you can't see the numbers. Choose 2 cards at a time and see if you can add the numbers together. What is the highest score you make?</p> <p>MEASURE MADNESS Last week we compared things. This week do you think you could use a ruler to measure things in cm. We put a ruler in your learning pack before school closed. Find 10 different objects around your house that you can measure with a ruler.</p> <p>Maths sheet Have a go at the maths activity mat. You can use paper to help you answer the questions and even draw the pictures yourself. We have attached the answers so you can check.</p> <p>SHAPE HUNT Can you hunt around the house and find things that are made from different shapes? Are they 2d or 3d? We have attached a shape mat to help you remember the shape names. I found a tin of beans and noticed that it is a cylinder shape. Can you record how many of each shape you find?</p> <p>MAKE A SHAPE Can you make some 2D and 3D shapes using materials in your home? Pencils, sticks, straw or even Lego are all great for this challenge! You could use some 4 pens to make a square. Maybe you could take photos when you have done it.</p>	<p>Reading Den/Quiet Space I know our houses are very busy at the minute and we can't really go out anywhere. We thought you could have a go at building your own den. You could do this with your family for you all to go inside or you could build your own so have your own quiet place. You can play with your toys in your den, or read a book or even have a little sleep inside it.
