

Reception Practical Learning from Home



This week we are looking at The 3 Little Pigs. Here are a selection of different practical activities you might like to try at home - please just do whatever you can.		
English	Maths	Wellbeing (PSHE, SMSC & RE)
*Work on formation of all letters a-z. Please ensure your child uses a pencil so they can practice easily and rub letters out if they make a mistake. Please ensure they have wide lines to practice their letters on (about the width of a ruler as children's letters may still be big at this stage which is fine). *Have a look at the books you have at home. Do you have any books with pigs in? *Tell a grown-up the story of The 3 Little Pigs. Remember to use different voices for the different characters! *The 3 Little Pigs had grown up and were moving into a house all by themselves. Can you discuss with your grown up what the 3 little pigs need to move into their new house? Draw pictures of these. *Write a sentence about the pigs. Don't forget your capital letter at the beginning of your sentence, finger spaces between words and a full stop at the end of your sentence.	*Have a look around your house, do you have 3 of anything? Miss Weston has 3 cushions on the couch and Miss Stockton has 3 bedrooms in her house. *Using toy bricks (Lego or blocks) do some Maths using questions such as - The pig bought 2 bricks but decided he needed 2 more. How many has he got altogether? *With your grown up pretend they work at The Big Bad Wolf Estate Agents. With some money have a look if you can make the amounts to buy different houses. A house made of straw could cost £1, a house made of sticks could cost £3 and a house made of bricks could cost £5. Which house is the most expensive? Why could that be? *Look at different coins and notes. Talk to your grown up about the similarities and differences between different coins and notes. Look at bank cards too – what numbers can you see? Can you spot your grown-ups name on it?	*Go outside into your garden or to your local park and take a bag to collect some sticks. *Play What's The Time Mr Wolf!!

*Using the sticks you have gathered try and build a house made from sticks, straw (or something bendy like straw such as pipe cleaners or string) and bricks (lego). See which is the strongest house and use a hairdryer to see which one blows down easiest. Which is the strongest house? *When you go out for a walk have a look if there are any houses by your house for sale. Are they the same as yours? Or are they all different like The 3 Little Pigs? What is the same and what is different?	* Make yourself a pig or a wolf mask and practise acting out the story. *After The 3 Little Pigs had got rid of the Big Bad Wolf they lived together in the brick house. After a while they decided it was too small for all of them and they needed to build a new house. Draw a picture of a new house that you have designed for The 3 Little Pigs and label it to show why it is perfect for them.	* Put your toys into groups of 3. *Build a house or make your own cosy den. *Read a story to a teddy, pet or sibling.
