






# Year 3 - Practical Learning from Home

<p><b>Task 1 - Read a short story or a chapter</b> of a book. Can you write comprehension questions using the common question starters: what, who, where, when, why. Example- <b>Why did the Gingerbread Man jump out of the oven? Where was Little Red Riding Hood going to?</b></p> <p><b>Task 2 - Enjoying reading</b> - What does an author do? An author chooses everything about a book- where it is set, what happens, who the characters are, what those characters are like. This is called authorial intent. Write a paragraph about your favourite author and why you have chosen them. Think carefully about range of books we have read together in class or at home.</p> <p><b>Task 3 - National Writing Day challenge</b> You are going to take part in a 24/7 challenge. <b>There are just three rules: 1. You are going to write a brilliant short story. 2. Your story must start with the words 'One day'. 3. You will write it in just 7 minutes!</b></p> <p><b>Task 4 - Characters.</b> When authors create a new character they have to know everything about them. This means answering a lot questions about what that character is like. Create your own character, draw them and write a description think about the character- What's the character's name? How does the character behave? What do they like to do? How old are they? What do they look like? What do they feel and what are they thinking? Remember to use good adjectives.</p> <p><b>Task 5 - Reading Comprehension.</b> Reading comprehension. Read the information text 'Hindu Gods' and complete the questions. See text attached</p>	<p><b>Lesson 1- Recognise turns and right angles.</b> An angle is a gap between two lines, it measures how far two lines have turned away from each other, you can make angles with two pencils. Angles are linked to turns, a full turn being a full circle. A quarter of a full turn is called a right angle, so there are two right angles in half a turn or half a circle , three right angles in a three quarter turn and four right angles in a full turn all being the same size 90 degrees. How many right angles can you find around your home? Can you make a right angle checker?</p>  <p>A quarter of a full turn is called a right angle. There are 2 right angles in half a turn. There are 3 right angles in 3 quarters of a turn. There are 4 right angles in a full turn.</p>  <p><b>Lesson 2- Right angles in shapes.</b> Draw all the shapes that you think will have right angles. Can you draw the right angle or right angles on each shape?</p> <p>Remember angles are drawn with a curved line, right angles are drawn with a straight line.</p>  <p><b>Lesson 3- Horizontal and vertical.</b> These words are names for a type of line. Horizontal line is straight across, they don't go up, down or curve. Vertical line goes straight up. Can you find shapes that have horizontal or vertical lines of symmetry.</p>  <p>This shape has a line of symmetry but it is neither horizontal nor vertical.</p> <p><b>Lesson 4- Horizontal and vertical.</b> Some shapes may have both horizontal or vertical lines of symmetry- can you draw them?</p> <p><b>Lesson 5 - Times table practice</b></p>	<p><b>National Sports Week</b></p> <p><b>PE-</b> Games-Throw rolled up socks/ball in air. How many claps before you catch? Egg and Soon Race - Can you reach the end of room/garden and back without dropping egg/ball?</p>  <p><b>Fitness Challenge</b></p> <p>Over the next 2 weeks can you run 10/15 or 20 laps /lengths of your garden every day. Can you beat your time each day? Record your time on day 1 and your time on day 14.
