



#### Adding whole tens in your head

If you know that 7 + 5 = 12 then it is easy to work out 70 + 50 and 700 + 500.

$$7 + 5 = 12$$
  
 $70 + 50 = 120$   
 $700 + 500 = 1200$  See the pattern?

Think of 70 + 50 as 7 tens plus 5 tens, which equals 12 tens.

Think of 700 + 500 as 7 hundreds plus 5 hundreds, which is 12 hundreds.




